



Which Hat Fits?

This session covered the different roles IST will play in advance of the Jamboree as well as the roles on offer to IST at the Jamboree. If you feel that the new information you received as part of this session or the weekend means you want to change your role preferences, please take the following actions:

- UK roles - Please log into [EventsAir](#) and amend your UK role preferences by the 30th June.
- Jamboree roles - if you have already submitted your Jamboree organisers' registration please [email](#) them your amended preferences. If you have not already registered, we encourage you to do this as soon as possible to give you the best chance of getting your preferred role.

Job responsibility

It is the IST's role to support the Jamboree Organising Team (JOT) to deliver an amazing experience for young people. You will work in an international team and be taught the skills you need to carry out your role.

Every IST member will be allocated a job and with each job comes the obligation to carry out this task to the best of your ability. We understand that the JOT team are keen that all IST deliver on their responsibility as well as have a fantastic Jamboree. IST's attendance will be monitored at this Jamboree.

We understand that the organisers have begun to review preference requests and will be informing IST from now until the Jamboree. For some IST your role may not be confirmed until you are at the Jamboree and you should prepare yourself for this.

Why choose a Jamboree role?

- The opportunity to work in a multinational team.

Why choose a UK role?

- The guarantee of knowing your role before you go.
- The opportunity to work alongside fellow UK IST and form a team ahead of the Jamboree.
- To participate in helping the UK Contingent in organising aspects of the experience in advance.

UK IST roles

There is an amazing array of Jamboree roles to choose from, such as canopy tours to retail and skate boarding, working in a truly international team. In addition to the Jamboree organiser roles, the UK Contingent has some exciting IST roles.

You should only select UK Contingent roles if you have the passion, skills and experience for one of the roles and if working with other people from the UK is how you would like to spend your Jamboree experience.

It is not mandatory to select a UK Contingent role, and if you have selected one and would now prefer to have a Jamboree role, you can remove the UK Contingent role choice from your EventsAir record.





UK Pavilion

The UK Pavilion is a place at the Jamboree for us to showcase the UK and UK Scouting, and will form part of the World Point area of the Jamboree Site - these areas have previously been known as the World Village. The UK Pavilion will be manned by UK IST.

At this Jamboree, the organisers are looking to integrate the Pavilions into the main programme so are looking for something more than just some display boards. The UK Contingent are in the process of recruiting a Pavilion Manager via Scout Volunteer Vacancies and generating a proposal for the Pavilion. Any member of the IST can apply for this role.

In advance of the Jamboree there may be a need for additional team weekends, and you may need to travel to the Jamboree in advance of other IST.

Expressions of interest in Pavilion roles can be made via EventsAir before 30th June 2018.

Food House

Our vision is to create a unique space where participants, Leaders, IST and day visitors can embrace UK culture, food and entertainment. We want everyone to be able to eat and drink delicious food, express themselves and entertain others, whilst making friendships from across the world.

As the one of the biggest Contingents at the Jamboree, the UK has an opportunity to showcase what UK Scouting is about, through the delivery of a high-quality food house.

We're looking for people to join our team to do jobs including:

- Food prep, cooking & serving
- Customer services, clear-up & promotion
- Stage & programme

The great thing about the Food House is that you'll be able to do something different every day, by rotating around the different roles. You could be someone who would prefer to stay in a team in the kitchen or prefer to serve coffees all day, all are welcome! We are looking for people who are excited about representing the UK and being part of a team committed to delivering an awesome Food House!

We are looking for all types of people to support our team, those who have a can-do attitude and can smile through the challenges! There are no essential skills, knowledge or experience.





The desirable knowledge areas are:

- Catering practices and principles
- Food hygiene principles
- Kitchen safety practices
- Allergy awareness

The desirable skills are:

- Cash handling
- Basic numeracy
- Foreign language ability
- Food control & hygiene practices
- Time keeping
- Prioritisation

The desirable experiences are:

- Working in a café
- Working in a camp kitchen
- Public customer service

We are particularly interested in hearing from anyone who is experienced in cash and cashless payment systems, stock control & sales analysis.

In addition to the second IST weekend in 2019, there may be additional optional weekends with the Food House team to help with preparation and team bonding.

High ropes and climbing roles

The organisers are particularly keen to receive applications from people who are keen to use their skills in high ropes and climbing at the Jamboree.

If this is an activity you are interested in, please select it as a preference as a Jamboree Role within the Jamboree organisers' registration portal.

With Scouting looking to provide skills for life, we are looking to ensure the Jamboree leaves a legacy of approximately 50 trained instructors with additional qualifications or new permit holders to support local Scouting and Guiding in the UK.

Tell me more about High ropes and climbing...

What level of experience do I need? Existing qualifications are preferable but we are also looking for those with a keen interest in climbing and high ropes and the enthusiasm to learn.

What qualifications (Scout / Guide and American / European) will I need? You'll need to be qualified to the American standards. We're working with the European and American qualifications bodies to ensure this happens.

What will we provide? We will map any existing qualifications to the American qualifications. We will either train you from scratch or offer courses for the qualification you need including a bespoke training course to bridge the gap between the European and American qualification standards.

We'll cover the cost of the courses and hope to have them on offer at different locations across the UK. Please note travel costs will not be provided.

What time commitment do I need to make? You'll need about eight weekends between now and the Jamboree to get through the training. You'll also need to make some time to go climbing in your own time to make sure you keep the skills you are learning fresh in your mind.

If you have expressed an interest with the organisers for climbing or intend to change your preference with the organisers to climbing, please use the option on EventsAir to let us know and tell us what skills you have.





UK Contingent IST Support

The UK Contingent requires a number of people to act as a 'UK Listening Ear' to support fellow UK Contingent IST.

UK Contingent Communications Team

The UK Contingent is looking for people with specific skills in communication (visual, written and digital) to support the existing UK Contingent Communications Team.

Work in advance of the Jamboree will be required as part of this role. If you are interested in the role, then contact the [Communications Team](#).

Unit Support

For this Jamboree we are offering to formally link IST members with local Units, and we would like at least two IST to be linked to assist each Unit. This will foster links for you with others in the Contingent and will better enable you to shape your own experience and that of the young people. It may even be an opportunity to base a Personal Development goal around.

Linking with a Unit will hopefully also provide you with a great place of refuge and a friendly welcome when you have 'down time' at Jamboree. Your role is not to replace the Leaders, but to support them, in a structured manner.

So what does the role entail?


1. Act with other IST members supporting a specific Unit
2. Liaise with and get to know the four Unit Leaders
3. Get to know, and become known by, the young people in the Unit
4. By invitation, attend Unit training and fundraising events
5. Be an additional planning and delivery resource to be deployed by the Unit Leader team if necessary





The Dos and Don'ts

Do	Don't
Support the Unit Leaders	Don't try to become another Unit Leader
Help out where Unit Leaders require	Don't think you have to be at every Unit event, you do not (and you should only attend by prior agreement with Unit Leaders)
Offer your own skills to embellish those in the Leader team	Don't think you need to attend Unit Leader meetings, that is not for IST
Be part of the delivery team for a Unit activity, but not necessarily part of the planning team	Don't limit your involvement to supporting Units from your 'home' county. You can volunteer to support Units in other places too (e.g. if at University or you work away from home)
Assist at fundraising events. After liaising with the Unit Leaders see if you also can benefit from that fundraising	Don't think that if you're not offered this role you cannot support or liaise with Units to offer support, you can!
Enjoy yourself, this a great part of your own journey	
Set a Personal Development goal and help the young people sign off their own.	





Jamboree IST roles

You must register with the Jamboree organisers, and we encourage IST members to do this as soon as possible to give you the best chance of getting a role you would prefer. Follow the link provided in the EventsAir registration confirmation email.

It is crucial that you use the same details on the organisers' registration system as EventsAir, especially your name. You must use your name as it appears on your passport for both registration systems.

As part of your registration you will need to select your IST Jamboree role preference from the list of [roles](#).

Even if you have applied for a UK Contingent role, you must apply for a Jamboree IST role. Following your Jamboree registration, the organisers will review your preferences and contact you to offer you a role. You have the option to accept or reject this offer. You will subsequently offered a new option. For those selecting a UK role preference we will review the applications and be offering roles. At this point you will be require to confirm if you are to keep your Jamboree role or accept a UK role.

You will require an electronic passport-style photograph to upload as part of your registration. We are aware some IST did not upload a passport photo during registration. If you did not upload a photo please do not worry. At this time we understand this is not critical to the registration.
